Our Path "Sabilouna" Level 2: Elements of the book

The book consists of **seven educational units**, in addition to a special section devoted to a **general review** at the beginning of the academic year. Each unit consists of an array of materials. Some of these are taught on a regular basis such as the Holy Qur'an and others are taught alternatively with other materials as they will be thouroughly explained in detail in the **"Unit Guide."**

Our Path to Review

"And remember, for remembrance benefits the believers."

The contents in the book made available to learners are rich and diverse. However, learners tend to forget. That is why, we have opted for starting the book with review materials to help learners remember and consolidate the basic knowledge acquired during the previous year. It is incumbent on teachers to allocate the appropriate time to achieve the objectives of the education process' vital stages.

The Holy Qur'an is our Path

Unlike other books, we have adopted a new distribution of the Holy Quran verses. In this book, learners are expected to memorize **7 Surahs**.

Al-Zalzala, Al-Bayyina, Al-Qadr, Al-Alaq, At-Tin, Al-Sharh and Ad-Dhuha. Due to the fact that learners are older and they have acquired some of the basics of the Arabic language and due to the length of the selected surahs, we have added new activities to this content such as explaining key words, interpreting meanings, and drawing lessons from the texts of the Qur'an and Hadith. We have also been keen to develop a well-studied and designed cognitive and mental methodology that takes the learners through regular stages that range from understanding and drawing lessons to memorization, remembrance, and practice.

Our Path to Islamic Ethics

Ethics is fundamental to Islamic and universal values that we want to instill in children. A good deed is doing good of all kinds, helping people, being kind to them, and mastering religious and worldly work. The topics that we have deemed relevant to children are varied: **Kindness**, **keeping one's tongue**, **being kind to one's neighbor**, **respecting people**, **seeking knowledge**, **and road discipline and etiquette**.

These topics enable a combination and synthesis of Islamic education and civil education, and the idea of the "good child" (from the point of view Islamic law) and "the good citizen" (from the civil point of view).

This section contains new approaches that provide references and advice that have a direct impact on the behavior of young learners.

Methodologically, we have chosen that learners go through the stages of discovering the value and memorizing the verse or Hadith that contains it. Then, learners understand the value and the Hadith, draw lessons and finally remember and act on the value.

Our Path to worship

In the second level, more focus was placed on prayer, its conditions, and how to perform it along with the prayer-related rituals and obligations such as the call to prayer and ablution.... In addition, there is focus on appropriate applications and training and highlighting the impact of prayers on the lives of children.

Worship lessons are presented alternately with faith related lessons.

Our Path to Beliefs / Faith

In this book, young learners are introduced to the attributes of Almighty Allah through His sublime Names: God is the Giver of Blessings, the All-Knowing, the All-Aware, the Powerful, the Almighty...

These attributes are well esteemed by children who need to understand them in order to enhance their attachment to Almighty Allah.

Worship lessons are presented alternately with faith related lessons.

Our Path in Religion and Language

"I am learning about my religion and my language": It is a new section that we haven't adopted in any of our previous courses. For those who use the Arabic courses (Especially the "Learn and Master" series), this section provides an opportunity to consolidate the acquisition of the Arabic language lessons through a range of educational scenarios and drills that are related to the religious materials presented.

Therefore, the acquisition of the Arabic lessons (Expression, reading, copying and dictation...) is reviewed and supported during the Islamic education class by adopting religious vocabulary and contents in a way that enhances the attainment of religion and language and the relationship between them.

Our Path to The Messenger's Life

Biography lessons aim to introduce the Messenger Muhammed (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) and his high qualities to young learners to hold very dear, emulate him, and believe in his message.

Biography lessons are presented in conjunction with Islamic story lessons.

Our Path in Islamic Stories, Supplications and Islamic chants

We have made Surat that the books for young learners are not devoid of stories that would excite their minds and comfort their souls. The selected stories help young learners draw lessons and act upon them.

The stories section is presented in combination with traditional sections such as chants and supplications that aim to instill values, help with linguistic fluency, refine taste, and draw closer to Almighty Allah.

We have included in the second level a selection of famous Islamic poems that serve specific moral purposes. We have also made Surat to conclude each educational unit with a selected supplication from the Holy Quran.

Commitment is our Path

We have included the concept of "**commitment**" within dialogues that allow learners to act and embody values in real life situations.

The dialogues revolve around the central headings of the units, such as cooperation, friendship, brotherhood, family ties, and etiquette of greetings. At the same time, these real-life dialogues enhance the linguistic assets of young learners.

Our Path to Our Culture

Most of what young learners know about religion is orders, prohibitions, rules and rulings, in the absence of a religious culture that opens new horizons for learning that attract learners and support their reasons and motivations for belonging to this great religion. The information is related to the content of the units selected in our books. For more clarity, the section includes pictures (major Islamic mosques) and various numbers and data (the number of Muslims in the world...).

Our Path to Review

Given the abundance and richness of content that learners benefit from in each educational unit, we have been keen to allocate a section at the end of each session that helps learners remember the information and the acquired knowledge and review them in a funny, entertaining, and useful way.

To ease the teaching task and and ensure the new book's effective use of contents, we have endeavored to provide a time distribution for each educational unit to assist the teacher in managing time effenciently and effectively distributing the extensive materials in the book.

1 The stage of basics:

- This stage covers three educational levels: Preparatory, first and second levels.
 Methodologically, this stage is built around the triangle of discovery, motivation and facilitation.
- To allow young learners to get to know the basics of Islam such as the Holy Quran, ethics, the sayings and life of the Prophet(PBUH), rituals and beliefs.
- To fortify the psychological relationship and the cultural bond between young learners and Islam by focusing on its human dimensions and its impact in their daily life.



2 The stage of specificities:

- This stage covers two educational levels: The third and fourth levels.
 Methodologically, it is built around an in depth understanding and debate while consolidating previous knowledge.
- Reinforce the general principles acquired by young learners during the stage of the basics with in depth memorization, understanding, elaboration and practice.
- Enhance the knowledge of the main pillars of Islam and belief drawing lessons from their general objectives with more emphasis on the Holy Quran and the Hadith through memorization, understanding and learning.



3 The stage of practical behavior:

- This stage covers two educational levels: The fifth and sixth levels. Given the fact that the learners reach the age of discretion, the stage focuses on the concepts of commitment and responsibility.
- Develop the skills of reflection, deduction, conclusion among the learners to enable them to distinguish between right and wrong, good and evil in order to adopt the right behavior.
- Enrich the learners' knowledge in the field of rituals and social relationships which enables them to understand the objectives of practicing their religious duties and the merit of reward and punishment.
